Galatians 5.22-23

This list is of The Fruit of the Spirit

But <u>the fruit of the Spirit</u> is love, joy, peace, patience, kindness, goodness, faithfulness, gentleness, self-control; against such things there is no law.

| Corinthians 13.4-8a

This list is of The Attributes of Love

<u>Love is</u> patient and kind; love does not envy or boast; it is not arrogant or rude. It does not insist on its own way; it is not irritable or resentful; it does not rejoice at wrongdoing, but rejoices with the truth. Love bears all things, believes all things, hopes all things, endures all things. Love never ends.

Ephesians 6.14-18

This list is of What we do and do not wrestle with + The Armor of God

For we <u>do not wrestle against</u> flesh and <u>blood</u>, <u>but against</u> the <u>rulers</u>, against the <u>authorities</u>, against the <u>cosmic</u> powers over this present darkness, against the <u>spiritual forces of evil in the heavenly places</u>. Therefore, take up <u>the</u> <u>whole armor of God</u>, that you may be able to withstand in the evil day, and having done all, to stand firm. Stand therefore, having fastened on the belt of truth, and having put on the breastplate of righteousness, and, as shoes for your feet, having put on the readiness given by the gospel of peace. In all circumstances take up the shield of faith, with which you can extinguish all the flaming darts of the evil one; and take the helmet of salvation, and the sword of the Spirit, which is the word of God</u>, praying at all times in the Spirit, with all prayer and supplication.

Romans 12.4-8

This list is of Gifts within the Body of Christ

For as in one body we have many members, and the members do not all have the same function, so we, though many, are one body in Christ, and individually members one of another. <u>Having gifts that differ according to the grace given to us</u>, let us use them: if prophecy, in proportion to our faith; if service, in our serving; the one who teaches, in his teaching; the one who exhorts, in his exhortation; the one who contributes, in generosity; the one who leads, with zeal; the one who does acts of mercy, with cheerfulness.

Hebrews 6.1-3

This list is of **Elementary doctrine**

Therefore, let us leave the <u>elementary doctrine</u> of Christ and go on to maturity, not laying again a foundation of repentance from dead works and of faith toward God, and of instruction about washings, the laying on of hands, the resurrection of the dead, and eternal judgment. And this we will do if God permits.

James 3.13-18

This list is of False Wisdom & True Wisdom

Who is wise and understanding among you? By his good conduct let him show his works in the meekness of wisdom. But if you have bitter jealousy and selfish ambition in your hearts, do not boast and be false to the truth. This is not the wisdom that comes down from above, but is earthly, unspiritual, demonic. For where jealousy and selfish ambition exist, there will be disorder and every vile practice. But the wisdom from above is first pure, then peaceable, gentle, open to reason, full of mercy and good fruits, impartial and sincere.

Titus 1.5-9

This list is of The Attributes of Elders

Appoint elders in every town as I directed you - if anyone is above reproach, the husband of one wife, and his children are believers and not open to the charge of debauchery or insubordination. <u>For an overseer</u>, as God's steward, must be above reproach. He must not be arrogant or quick-tempered or a drunkard or violent or greedy for gain, but hospitable, a lover of good, self-controlled, upright, holy, and disciplined. He must hold firm to the trustworthy word as taught, so that he may be able to give instruction in sound doctrine and also to rebuke those who contradict it.

| Samuel 8.10-18

So, Samuel told all the words of the Lord to the people who were asking for a king from him. He said, "These will be the ways of the king who will reign over you: <u>he will take</u> your sons and appoint them to his chariots and to be his horsemen and to run before his chariots. And he will appoint for himself commanders of thousands and commanders of fifties, and some to plow his ground and to reap his harvest, and to make his implements of war and the equipment of his chariots. <u>He will take</u> your daughters to be perfumers and cooks and bakers. <u>He will take</u> the best of your fields and vineyards and olive orchards and give them to his servants. <u>He will take</u> the tenth of your grain and of your vineyards and give it to his officers and to his servants. <u>He will take</u> your male servants and female servants and the best of your young men and your donkeys, and put them to his work. <u>He will take</u> the tenth of your flocks, and you shall be his slaves. And in that day you will cry out because of your king, whom you have chosen for yourselves, but the Lord will not answer you in that day."

II Corinthians 9.7-8

Each one must give as he has decided in his heart, not reluctantly or under compulsion, for God loves a cheerful giver. And God is able to make <u>all</u>grace abound to you, so that having <u>all</u>sufficiency in all things at <u>all</u>times, you may abound in <u>every</u> good work.

Philippians 1.3-11

I thank **my** God in all **my** remembrance of **you**, always in every prayer of **mine** for **you** all making **my** prayer with joy, because of **your** partnership in the gospel from the first day until now. And **I** am sure of this, that he who began a good work in **you** will bring it to completion at the day of Jesus Christ. It is right for **me** to feel this way about **you** all, because **I** hold **you** in **my** heart, for **you** are all partakers with **me** of grace, both in **my** imprisonment and in the defense and confirmation of the gospel. For God is **my** witness, how **I** yearn for **you** all with the affection of Christ Jesus. And it is **my** prayer that **your** love may abound more and more, with knowledge and all discernment, so that **you** may approve what is excellent, and so be pure and blameless for the day of Christ, filled with the fruit of righteousness that comes through Jesus Christ, to the glory and praise of God.

11 Peter 2.4-10

For <u>if</u> God did not spare angels when they sinned, but cast them into hell and committed them to chains of gloomy darkness to be kept until the judgment; <u>if</u> he did not spare the ancient world, but preserved Noah, a herald of righteousness, with seven others, when he brought a flood upon the world of the ungodly; <u>if</u> by turning the cities of Sodom and Gomorrah to ashes he condemned them to extinction, making them an example of what is going to happen to the ungodly; and <u>if</u> he rescued righteous Lot, greatly distressed by the sensual conduct of the wicked (for as that righteous man lived among them day after day, he was tormenting his righteous soul over their lawless deeds that he saw and heard); 9 then the Lord knows how to rescue the godly from trials, and to keep the unrighteous under punishment until the day of judgment, and especially those who indulge in the lust of defiling passion and despise authority.

1 John 4.7-12

Beloved, let us <u>love</u> one another, for <u>love</u> is from <u>God</u>, and whoever <u>loves</u> has been born of <u>God</u> and knows <u>God</u>. Anyone who does not <u>love</u> does not know <u>God</u>, because <u>God</u> is <u>love</u>. In this the <u>love</u> of <u>God</u> was made manifest among us, that <u>God</u> sent his only Son into the world, so that we might live through him. In this is <u>love</u>, not that we have <u>loved God</u> but that <u>He loved</u> us and sent <u>His</u> Son to be the propitiation for our sins. Beloved, if <u>God</u> so <u>loved</u> us, we also ought to <u>love</u> one another. No one has ever seen <u>God</u>; if we <u>love</u> one another, <u>God</u> abides in us and his <u>love</u> is perfected in us.

Isaiah 14.12-15

"How you are fallen from heaven, O Day Star, son of Dawn! How you are cut down to the ground, you who laid the nations low! You said in your heart, '<u>I will</u> ascend to heaven; above the stars of God <u>I will</u> set my throne on high; <u>I</u> will sit on the mount of assembly in the far reaches of the north; <u>I will</u> ascend above the heights of the clouds; <u>I will</u> make myself like the Most High.' But you are brought down to Sheol, to the far reaches of the pit.

James 3.13-18

Tools: Progressions

Hebrews 9.23-28

Thus it was necessary for the copies of the heavenly things to be purified with these rites, but the heavenly things themselves with better sacrifices than these. For Christ has entered, not into holy places made with hands, which are copies of the true things, but into heaven itself, now <u>to appear</u> in the presence of God ⁱon our behalf. Nor was it to offer himself repeatedly, as the high priest enters the holy places every year with blood not his own, for then he would have had to suffer repeatedly since the foundation of the world. But as it is, <u>he has appeared</u> once for all at the end of the ages to put away sin by the sacrifice of himself. And just as it is appointed for man to die once, and after that comes judgment, so Christ, having been offered once to bear the sins of many, <u>will appear a second time</u>, not to deal with sin but to save those who are eagerly waiting for him.

Hebrews 13.7-9

<u>Remember</u> your leaders, those who spoke to you the word of God. <u>Consider</u> the outcome of their way of life, and <u>imitate</u> their faith. Jesus Christ is the same <u>yesterday</u> and <u>today</u> and <u>forever</u>. Do not be led away by diverse and strange teachings, for it is good for the heart to be strengthened by grace, not by foods, which have not benefited those devoted to them.

Philippians 2.12-13

Therefore, my beloved, as you have always obeyed, so now, not only as in my presence but much more in my absence, <u>work out</u> your own salvation with fear and trembling, for it is God who <u>works in</u> you, both to will and to <u>work for</u> his good pleasure.

II Corinthians 1.9-10

<u>He delivered us</u> from such a deadly peril, and <u>he will deliver us</u>. On him we have set our hope that <u>he will deliver</u> <u>us again</u>. You also must help us by prayer, so that many will give thanks on our behalf for the blessing granted us through the prayers of many.

1 Timothy 4.15-16

<u>Practice</u> these things; <u>immerse</u> yourself in them, so that all may see your <u>progress</u>. Keep a close watch on yourself and on the teaching. <u>Persist</u> in this, for by so doing you will save both yourself and your hearers.

Colossians 1.15-20

He is the image of the invisible God, the firstborn of all creation. For by Him all things were created, in heaven and on earth, visible and invisible, whether thrones or dominions or rulers or authorities—<u>all things were created</u> through Him and for Him. And He is before all things, and <u>in Him all things hold together</u>. And He is the head of the body, the church. He is the beginning, the firstborn from the dead, that in everything he might be preeminent. For in Him all the fullness of God was pleased to dwell, and <u>through Him</u> to <u>reconcile to Himself all things</u>, whether on earth or in heaven, making peace by the blood of His cross.

II Corinthians 9:10-11

He <u>who supplies seed to the sower</u> and bread for food <u>will supply and multiply your seed for sowing</u> and <u>increase</u> <u>the harvest</u> of your righteousness. You will be enriched in every way to be generous in every way, which through us will produce thanksgiving to God.

Tools: Contrasts

Matthew 5.17-20

Do not think that I have come to <u>abolish</u> the Law or the Prophets; I have not come to <u>abolish</u> them <u>BUT</u> to <u>fulfill</u> them. For truly, I say to you, until heaven and earth pass away, not an iota, not a dot, will pass from the Law until all is accomplished. Therefore, <u>whoever relaxes one of the least of these commandments and teaches others to do the same</u> will be called <u>least in the kingdom of heaven</u>, <u>BUT</u> whoever does them and teaches them</u> will be called <u>great</u> in the kingdom of heaven. For I tell you, unless your righteousness exceeds that of the scribes and Pharisees, you will never enter the kingdom of heaven.

Matthew 10.34-39

"Do not think that I have come to bring peace to the earth. I have not come to bring <u>peace</u>, <u>BUT</u> a <u>sword</u>. For I have come to set a man against his father, and a daughter against her mother, and a daughter-in-law against her motherin-law. And a person's enemies will be those of his own household. Whoever loves father or mother more than me is not worthy of me, and whoever loves son or daughter more than me is not worthy of me. And whoever does not take his cross and follow me is not worthy of me. Whoever <u>finds his life will lose it</u>, <u>AND</u> whoever <u>loses his life for</u> <u>my sake will find it</u>.

Romans 8.3-7

For God has done what the law, weakened by the flesh, could not do. By sending his own Son in the likeness of sinful flesh and for sin, he condemned sin in the flesh, in order that the righteous requirement of the law might be fulfilled in us, who walk <u>not according to the flesh</u> <u>BUT</u> <u>according to the Spirit</u>. For those who live <u>according to the flesh</u>, <u>BUT</u> <u>those who live according to the Spirit set their minds on the things of the flesh</u>, <u>BUT</u> those who live according to the Spirit set their minds on the things of the flesh. <u>BUT</u> those who live according to the Spirit set their minds on the things of the flesh is death, <u>BUT</u> to set the mind on the <u>Spirit is life and peace</u>.

| Corinthians 15.42-49

So is it with the resurrection of the dead. <u>What is sown is perishable</u>; <u>what is raised is imperishable</u>. It is <u>sown in</u> <u>dishonor</u>; it is <u>raised in glory</u>. It is <u>sown in weakness</u>; it is <u>raised in power</u>. It is <u>sown a natural body</u>; it is <u>raised a</u> <u>spiritual body</u>. If there is a <u>natural body</u>, there is <u>ALSO</u> <u>a spiritual body</u>. Thus it is written, "<u>The first man Adam</u> <u>became a living being</u>"; <u>the last Adam became a life-giving spirit</u>. But it is not the <u>spiritual</u> that is first <u>BUT</u> the <u>natural</u>, and then the <u>spiritual</u>. The <u>first man was from the earth, a man of dust</u>; the <u>second man is from heaven</u>. <u>AS</u> was <u>the man of dust</u>, <u>SO</u> also are <u>those who are of the dust</u>, and <u>AS</u> is <u>the man of heaven</u>, <u>SO</u> also are <u>those who are</u> <u>of the man of dust</u>, we shall <u>ALSO bear the image of the man of heaven</u>.

James 1.22-27

<u>BUT be doers of the word</u>, and not <u>hearers only</u>, deceiving yourselves. For if anyone is <u>a hearer of the word</u> and not <u>a doer</u>, he is like a man <u>who looks intently at his natural face in a mirror</u>. For <u>he looks at himself</u> and goes away and at once <u>forgets</u> what he was like. <u>BUT the one who looks into the perfect law</u>, <u>the law of liberty, and perseveres</u>, being <u>no hearer</u> who <u>forgets BUT a doer who acts</u>, he will be blessed in his doing. <u>If anyone thinks he is religious</u> and does not bridle his tongue but deceives his heart, this person's religion is worthless. <u>Religion that is pure and</u> <u>undefiled before God</u>, the Father, is this: to visit orphans and widows in their affliction, and to keep oneself <u>unstained from the world</u>.

II Corinthians 4.16-18

So we do not lose heart. Though our <u>outer self is wasting away</u>, our <u>inner self is being renewed day by day</u>. For this <u>light momentary affliction</u> is preparing for us an <u>eternal weight of glory</u> beyond all comparison, <u>AS</u> we <u>look not to</u> the things that are seen <u>BUT</u> to <u>the things that are unseen</u>. For <u>the things that are seen are transient</u>, <u>BUT</u> the <u>things</u> <u>that are unseen</u> are <u>unseen</u> are <u>transient</u>.

Be thankful With thankfulness Giving thanks If then you have been <u>raised</u> with Christ, seek the things that are <u>above</u>, where Christ is, seated at the right hand of God. <u>Set your minds on things that are above</u>, <u>not on</u> <u>things that are on earth</u>. For you have died, and <u>your life is hidden with Christ</u> in God. When <u>Christ who is your life appears</u>, then <u>you also will appear with him in</u> <u>glory.</u>

<u>Put to death therefore what is earthly in you</u>: sexual immorality, impurity, passion, evil desire, and covetousness, which is idolatry. On account of <u>these</u> the wrath of God is coming. In <u>these</u> you too once walked, when you were living in them. But now you must <u>put them all away</u>: anger, wrath, malice, slander, and obscene talk from your mouth. Do not lie to one another, seeing that you have <u>put off the old</u> <u>self</u> with its practices and <u>have put on the new self</u>, which is being renewed in knowledge after the image of its creator. <u>Here</u> there is not Greek and Jew, circumcised and uncircumcised, barbarian, Scythian, slave, free; but Christ is all, and in all.

<u>Put on then, as God's chosen ones, holy and beloved</u>, compassionate hearts, kindness, humility, meekness, and patience, bearing with one another and, if one has a complaint against another, forgiving each other; as the Lord has forgiven you, so you also must forgive. And above all these <u>put on</u> love, which binds everything together in perfect harmony. And <u>let</u> the peace of Christ rule in your hearts, to which indeed you were called in one body. And <u>be thankful</u>. <u>Let the word</u> of Christ dwell in you richly, teaching and admonishing one another in all wisdom, singing psalms and hymns and spiritual songs, <u>with thankfulness</u> in your hearts to God. And whatever you <u>do</u>, in word or deed, <u>do</u> everything in the name of the Lord Jesus, <u>giving thanks</u> to God the Father through him.
